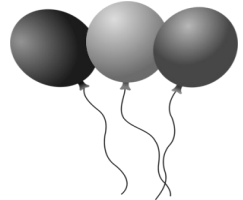

We are continuing our efforts to support this work. Appropriate clothing and shoes are being collected and stored in the Gathering Place until the next container is ready to be shipped.

It has been suggested that the children (and adults) shift their mission giving from the well-digging project to the M.O.M. Project (Making Orphan Meals). Fifty cents will provide one meal to a hungry child. God has given Partners 4 Africa the opportunity to provide nutritious meals for approximately 600 orphans on a weekly basis. Many elderly and homeless also benefit through this feeding program.

We have seen the joy children feel at being a part of meeting a basic need of people less fortunate than themselves. Encourage them to see how many meals they can provide for a hungry child. The collection jar is on the table by the doors.
